STATEMENT BY

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AT THE NAM MINISTERIAL MEETING

NEW YORK, 26 SEPTEMBER 2018 (09.00 - 13.00)

Mr. Chairman,

- 1. Today, we continue to face so many challenges across the globe.
- 2. We see before its very eyes,... the growing tendency and inclination towards unilateralism... protectionism... based on a zero-sum mindset.
 - → a proof of a clear deviation...
 - → from the basic principles and purposes...
 - → not only of the Movement.....but also of the UN Charter.
- 3. On that account, let me highlight 3 (three) main points:
- 4. <u>First</u>, we must re-position multilateralism at the center of our Movement.
- 5. Strengthening the UN system in promoting global peace must be put at the heart of our commitment.
- 6. This also means... putting respect of sovereignty and territorial integrity as well as non-use of force... as the basis...of promoting peaceful settlement of dispute.
- 7. For its part, Indonesia will continue to be a true partner for peace as a Non-Permanent Member of the Security Council for the period 2019-2020.

- 8. Second, our Movement should serve as the biggest source of support to the plight of the Palestinian people.
- Our support to Palestine is incomplete without the recognition of Palestine from all members of the Movement.
- 10. Indonesia calls on NAM Countries which have yet to recognize Palestine... to render their recognition as immediately as possible.
- 11.Let us reinforce our support... to Palestine's efforts in joining international organizations... and accede to various international treaties and conventions.
- 12. Our Movement's support to Palestine has witnessed a major setback... including one that is marked by the illegal act of changing the status quo of Jerusalem.
- 13. Indonesia is deeply concerned... by the decision made by a member of our Movement to relocate its embassy in Jerusalem.
- 14. This act is contrary to the guiding principles of the Non-Aligned Movement.
- 15. As to our commitment to multilateralism in promoting peaceful settlement of dispute,

- → we condemn and reject any notion and attempt to alter the status of East Jerusalem... and entirely turn it into the capital of Israel.
- 16. We urge all NAM Countries... with no exception... not to pursue the same illegal path of changing the status quo.
- 17. We call on all NAM Countries to request the UN Security Council... and the UN General Assembly to immediately take concrete measures... to determine that illegal act contravenes international laws.
- 18. We should remain committed to defend the two-state solution and the right of the Palestinian people to self-determination and statehood with East Jerusalem as the future of the Palestinian Capital.
- 19. Third, focus on education to move towards SDGs.
- 20. As an important element in fighting poverty, **education** is one of key elements in achieving SDGs.
- 21. We must strengthen our commitment in education by ensuring education for all as a principle part of our national policy,
 - → by increasing investments for better education program, and
 - → by strengthening our cooperation on education.

- 22. Governments must ensure adequate funding in education.
- 23. In Indonesia, allocating 20% of the national budget to education is a Constitutional mandate.
- 24. Cooperation in education is not only about financial and technical supports.
- 25. It requires collaborative and innovative processes involving multistakeholder efforts and partnerships.
- 26. As such, our Movement should take benefit of the existing Jakarta-based Non-Aligned Movement Centre for South-South Technical Cooperation or NAM CSSTC.
- 27. Indonesia has conducted over **522 capacity building** programs, including on Women and Youth Empowerment programs.
- 28.**6.685 participants** from Asia, Pacific, Africa, Middle East, and Latin America and the Caribbean, attended the programs.
- 29. Our international collaboration facilitated by NAM CSSTC further ensures the sustainability of the South-South Cooperation, its programs and funding.

Mr. Chairman,

- 30. Let me conclude by emphasizing **Indonesia's** readiness to work together with other NAM member countries and organizations.
- 31. Indonesia is ready to cooperate in **promoting the culture of dialogue** to find a common ground in solving our differences.
- 32. Thus, we can try to move forward in creating a better future for all members of the United Nations.
